RCA transition plan checklist

Getting ready for new TTM and National forward works viewer funding conditions

Overview

The safety of our road workers and users is a priority for NZTA, so we have updated our funding conditions to better balance safety, cost and disruption to road users. These changes come into effect 1 July 2026 and require transition to a new way of doing business for road controlling authorities (RCAs) for any contracts funded using National Land Transport Fund (NLTF) funding. All RCAs are required to have a plan for transition by 20 December 2025.

This document provides a checklist to guide with development of your transition plan. *This is not a specification.*

Changes are in two parts:

- a new requirement to use the NZ guide to temporary traffic management (NZGTTM) for all RCAs (including NZTA).
- for those RCAs that publish forward works programmes (FWP) on Forward Works Viewer, there is a new requirement for the full FWP to be published by September each year.

Transition plans don't require approval from NZTA — however, they will be reviewed so we can understand how best to support your organisation to meet the new funding requirements.

A second version of this checklist, showing NZTA's own transition work to date, is available as an example for RCAs to learn from.

NZGTTM transition

This checklist is arranged into four parts to help you plan your transition to NZGTTM. It covers how you *engage with contractors* safely as a client, how you *approve access* to the road corridor, how you *support your staff* with guidance and training and how you *report* to show funders that requirements are being met.

Items are organised into three categories:

Client – engaging with contractors

Forward works programme transition

This requirement applies only to <u>existing users</u> of the National Forward Works Viewer (FWV): Auckland Transport, Christchurch City Council, Gisborne District Council, Hamilton City Council, Napier City Council, Nelson City Council, New Plymouth District Council, Queenstown Lakes District Council, Selwyn District Council, Tasman District Council, Waitaki District Council and Wellington City Council.
