



MC in TTM: Risk Assessment (Level 4)

This course is designed for professionals with a health and safety role or responsibility in ensuring safe outcomes for activities conducted in, or impacting, the road corridor.

This includes anyone involved in temporary traffic management design, engineering, corridor management, planning, reviewing, assurance, regulatory and/or network access functions.



MC in TTM: Design (Level 4)

This course is designed for people who develop traffic management plans and need to understand the importance of, and principles behind, robust risk assessment and management.

It includes skills required to address the safety of relevant personnel who work with traffic management plans, including workers on a road or roadside temporary traffic management activity.

- MC in TTM: Assist with TTM within the

 Road Reserve (Level 3)
- MC in TTM: Mobile Operations (Level 3)

NZTA update

There are 4 warrants still being registered into the NZTA TTM training database:

- Inspector, STMS mobile non-practising, and STMS mobile will stop being offered as warrants when there is training and assessment on the NZQCF available to industry that covers equivalent skills.
- The timeline on this is yet to be determined, as we await confirmed release dates from training providers.
- We are aiming for KCTL warrants to be phased out from the NZTA TTM training database in the next few months. We are working with WasteMINZ to assist with the transition and transfer of information to an appropriate alternative and safe location.
